Over 275 years ago, Scots-Irish settlers like the Dill family established homes, farms and businesses in areas west of

the Susquehanna River as part of a new American Dream. The community of Dillsburg grew from those humble beginnings when Northern York County was still the frontier.

This legacy is celebrated annually with a 2 day, rain or shine event held at historic Dills Tavern to highlight Celtic history and heritage. Celtic crafters, artisans, vendors of traditional Celtic foods and beverages, musicians, and more will be a part of the festival along with family-friendly activities throughout the weekend.

Tickets are available for purchase online and at the gate for each day for \$15.00 and two-day tickets are available for \$25.00. Children ages 12 and under are free.

Ticket pre-sales end 48 hours before the event.

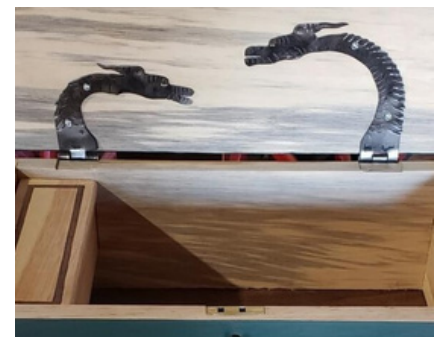

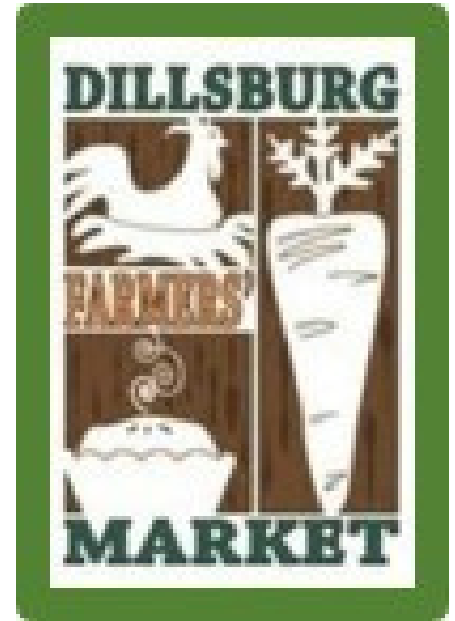
Farmers Market Resumes!

Volunteer Spotlight - Gary Reneker



Background...

I have been a member a little over 1 year, but I've been attending events for nearly 20 years. I have actively participated in Colonial and Early American lifestyles since 1978, focusing on American Indian and frontier cultures. Since childhood I was involved in gardening with my father. Later in life, after the military and college, I became a certified Master Gardener, and began studying vegetable and herb gardening in depth. My wife (deceased, also a Master Gardener) and I have taught many classes on gardening and using herbs at high schools and garden centers around South-Central PA. I have surrendered my MG certification, but I kept my knowledge, and enjoy adding to that knowledge and putting it to use.

My involvement with NYCHAPS...

Currently I have become involved in taking the Colonial Garden at Dills Tavern back to nothing but heirloom plants that would have been grown here from 1780-1820. Though it would be nice, and more efficient, to use some modern features, we are planting and maintaining the gardens as they would have done during that time period. As it is with most other activities at Dills Tavern, our focus is on educating the public. However, we don't just want to teach what they grew and how they grew food in "olden days". We also want our visitors and volunteers to learn how they can find benefits in their lives through gardening, regardless of the amount of space they have to invest.

Advice for members who are thinking of becoming more involved...

NYCHAPS is in need of volunteers at the Colonial Garden. They don't have to be Master Gardeners; only to have the willingness to work, and a desire to keep learning. Of course, if they are good gardeners, the more the better. The more volunteers we have, the less anyone would actually have to work.

NYCHAPS: A Focus on Collections

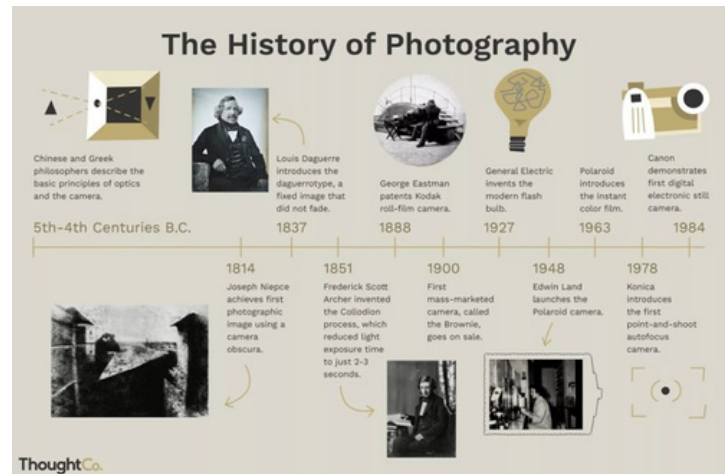
Part One - Photo Archives

Maple Shade Barn holds NYCHAPS collection of artifacts, documents, and genealogical materials in our museum and archives. NYCHAPS currently has over 6,000 historical photos or digital images from the Northern York County area in the collection. These range from Daguerreotypes and stereotypes to digital images.

Daguerreotypes were developed in the late 1830's but by the 1850's they were going out of style being replaced by Ambrotypes and tintypes. We have local examples of all of these in our collection. These early processes were replaced by wet plate negatives then dry gelatin process, which was highly inflammable, to cellulose acetate and finally something most people can identify with

Kodachrome film in 1935. Due to the nature of Daguerreotypes and Ambrotypes, they were usually presented in protective hinged cases. Tintypes as the name implies were produced on a thin tin plate, were cheaper and more durable than the earlier processes. Wet plate photographs were usually glued to dark hardboard and came in a myriad of sizes. All these images were produced by professional photographers. In the 1880's the Kodak No 1 camera became commercially available, and the era of the amateur photographer came into being. Many homes in the early 20th century had a Brownie camera and later in the century Instamatic cameras for snapshots or slides and Polaroid cameras were popular. Today most photography is by digital cameras or the ubiquitous cell phone.

While we are not able to allow open research in the archives, we are pleased to offer access to our collection of historical documents through the **NYCHAPS Archival Research Service**. Please contact the office to schedule an appointment.
